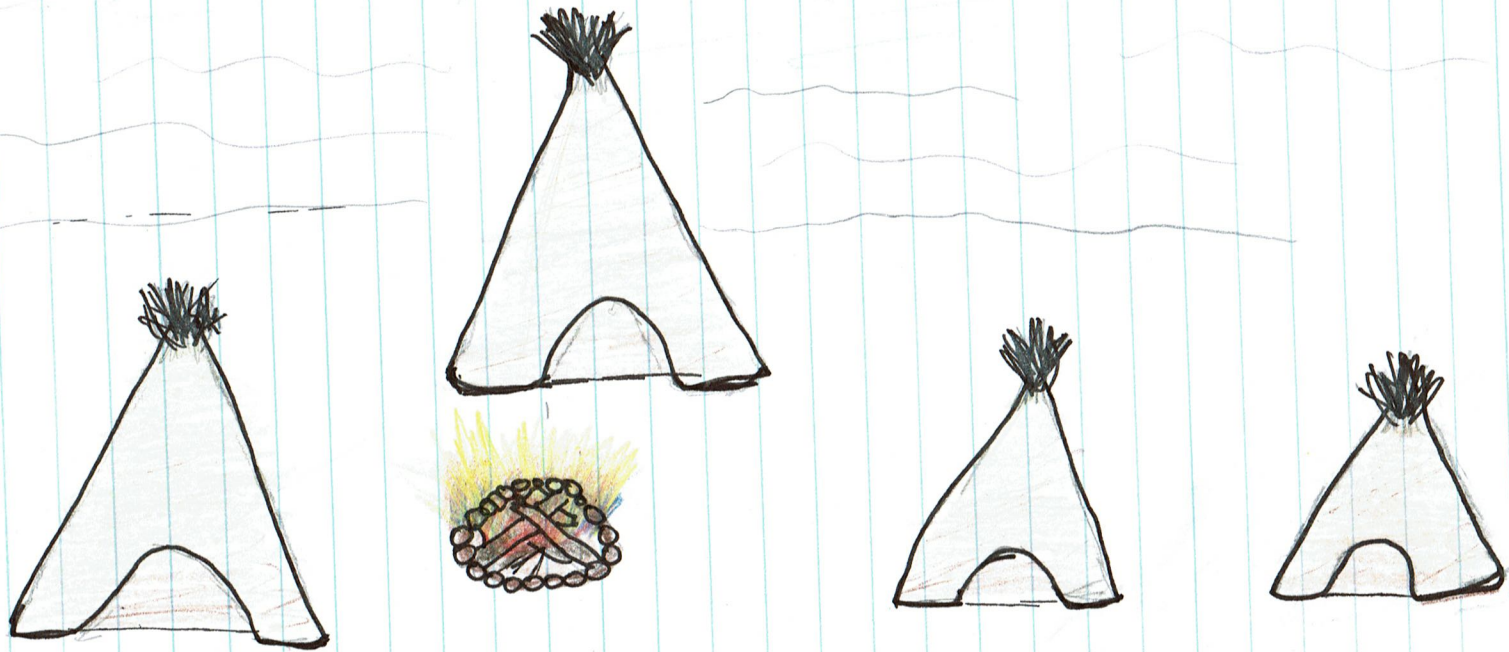
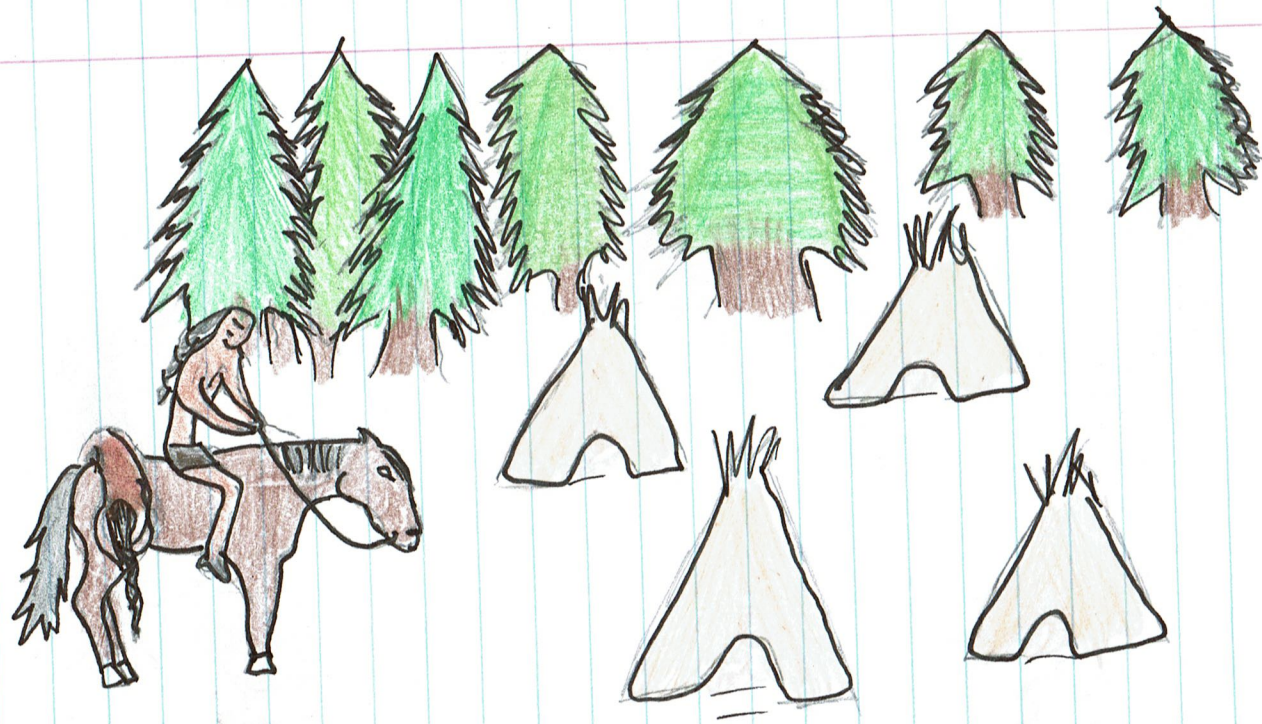


The Early Life of Sacagawea.

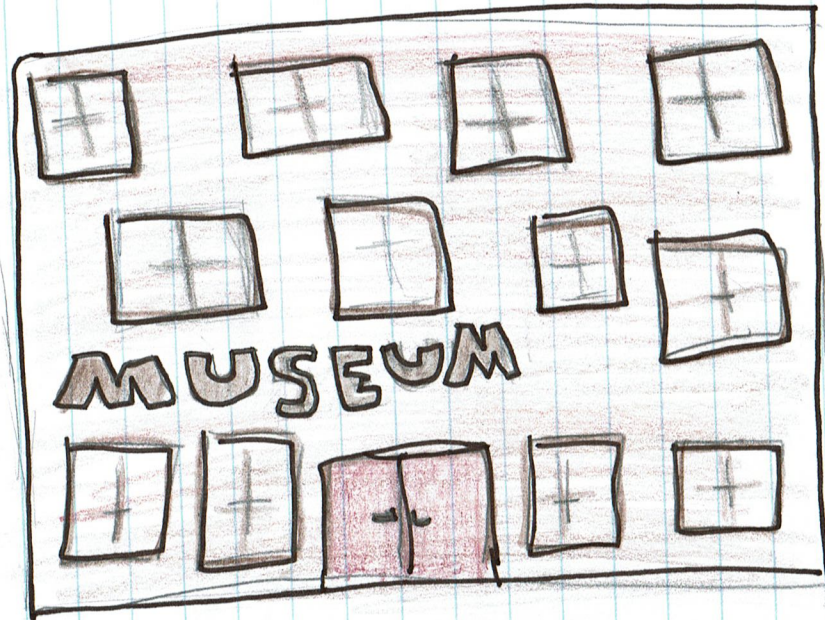


Sacagawea met Lewis and Clark on November 2, when she was about six months pregnant. Sacagawea and Charbonneau went with 31 other Corps members shortly after she gave birth to Jean-Baptiste Charbonneau on February 11, 1805.



Sacagawea gave birth to her daughter in August 1812. After she gave birth, her health decreased. She ended up getting ill with putrid fever. Sadly she passed away in December 1812, at age 25.
